
South Lagoon Algae Update

Due to the excessive amount of rainfall received early this year, both lagoons have experienced a significant drop in the level of salinity (percentage of salt in a body of water). This reduction creates a fresh water lens that enables aquatic vegetation to flourish when the body of water typically reaches 70 degrees. In May we were above the 70-degree mark for lagoon water temperature and low in salinity. The process of raising the salinity level, which deters algae growth, has been a challenge as Novato Creek salinity levels are still below their average level for this time of year. Extended lowering of the South Lagoon during flushing events has proven to dry out a significant amount of Filamentous Green Algae along the shoreline. The CSD will continue to extend lagoon lowering during flushing events and decreasing the life span of the algae by deploying an oxidizer approved for use.

The CSD truly appreciates resident participation in removing the algae from their shoreline and disposing in the green can, we know this is an arduous effort. We also urge residents to restrict the use of lawn and garden fertilizer that has high concentrations of nitrogen and phosphates as they are building blocks for continuous algae blooms throughout the summer season. The CSD will continue to monitor the algae and will also begin testing for nitrogen and phosphate levels, as well as, looking at increasing aeration in certain areas with low circulation.

Section 11.36.06-Water Skiing: "all water skiing shall follow a counter clockwise pattern, and shall be limited to the designated ski areas; as shown on the Water Safety Map

Section 11.36.065-Wake Surfing Prohibited: "no vessel operator shall intentionally engage in any water sport in which the sport participant is propelled entirely or substantially by the force of the vessels wake alone"

I would also like to remind residents that you are responsible for your boats wake and must abide by the "No Wake" zone areas as outline in the Waterways Map (see page 3). If you have guests please ensure that they the Waterway Regulations we can ensure a safe waterway for all to enjoy.

- 6. Please be advised that the Marin County Parking Enforcement is active in our community and enforcing the 72 hour rule on the streets.
- 7. Please ensure any water inflatable's are properly secured to your dock and within your docking easement. They are not to be anchored outside that easement where they can become a navigational issue. If they become an navigation issue they will be removed.


Joe Thomas 1919-2017

Flood Control Parcel Tax on November Ballot

On the November ballot Flood Control Zone #1 is placing a Parcel Tax measure to the voters which includes Bel Marin Keys. As you are probably aware there is a current Parcel Tax for the Flood Control District for Flood Control Maintenance, this new Parcel Tax of \$47 per year is for capital improvements to further reduce the water levels in a flood situation. Most of the water that is involved in the flooding in Novato and its surrounding areas is storm water runoff from the Novato Watershed. The County and Flood Control District undertook a multi-year Novato Watershed Study (http://marinwatersheds.org/novato.html) on the problems associated with the flooding in Novato and its surrounding areas.

From that study, which had significant input from our engineering firm, CLE Engineering, several solutions to reduce flooding levels were brought up, studied and evaluated for the best results. The projects that received the highest scores included many projects directly affecting the Novato Creek downstream of Highway 101. Over fifty percent of the funds generated by this Parcel Tax will be spent of the Lower Novato Creek from Hwy 101 out to the Bay. Planned projects, which are tentative until CEQA studies are completed, include increasing the Tidal Prism above Hwy 37 by over one hundred acres and sediment removal of the Lower Novato Creek plus pending studies concerning widening the Creek to increase the storm water throughput out to the Bay. There are other items not involving the creek included in the total Parcel Tax amount, such as, improving the storm water structure in Novato. This is about twenty percent of the funds expected and the remaining thirty percent goes to new pumps and repairs to critical flood control infrastructure that a susceptible to damage which would cause increased flooding.

Sunset Park All Fitness Equipment Installation

My name is Cole Fehring, I live in Bel Marin Keys (BMK) with my parents, Chris and Katrina Fehring and my younger brother and sister. I am a current Life Scout in Boy Scout Troop 79 here in Novato and am working on earning my final rank of Eagle Scout. A major part of earning the rank of Eagle Scout is to build a community project. As a resident of BMK, I wanted my Eagle project to benefit our community.

After working with CLE Engineering on a design based on community feedback, presenting to the Bel Marin Keys Community Services District Board of Directors and getting approval from the Boy Scouts Marin Council I have begun work to create a fitness circuit around the Keys. The construction of this fitness circuit is being kicked off

with my Eagle project which will be a pilot station for the circuit located in Sunset park along BMK Blvd. There are already plans to install more equipment at Montego Park and other community parks throughout the Keys in the coming years. The goal is to create a circuit throughout the Keys to give residents access to a balanced workout tailored to each person's fitness needs and pace.



For the pilot project at Sunset park I will be installing a three piece fitness equipment package. It will include a sit-up bench, captain's chair, push -up bar and instructional sign post. The equipment is being procured through Measure A funds which are earmarked for parks and open space projects throughout Marin County, of which Bel Marin Keys is a recipient of a certain percentage of funds each year.

Many thanks to family, friends and fellow residents for contributing to my GoFundMe account which has allowed me to get this pilot project started this summer. The project is slated to be completed by September 2017. Extra special thanks to Mr. Kyle MacDonald of CLE Engineering for mentoring me along the way.

Currently the Flood Control Zone #1 budget only gets about 15% of its budget (\$312,000) from the 1984 Parcel Tax, the rest (\$1,687,800) comes from the Flood Control Zone #1 share of property taxes. It is important to note that all of this money is collected into the Flood Control Zone #1 account and can only be spent in the Novato area. The County cannot use the funds for purposes other than flood control. The proposed Parcel Tax will bring in approximately \$1,100,000 annually and will leverage from two to three times that amount of Federal and State funds for the planned projects. As a result of the Novato Watershed Study we could potentially be getting the projects done for up to one third the cost with the new Parcel Tax in place. azSXC

"Think Before You Spray"

The Marin County Board of Supervisors approved funding in the amount of \$100,000 along with at \$90,040 grant from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to collaborate with community members to develop and implement a two-year campaign to raise awareness among Marin residents about alternatives to use of toxic landscape products and to reduce the overall use of pesticides. One herbicide in particular, RoundUp, has raised concerned due to the active ingredient, glyphosate, and declared by the World Health Organization (WHO) as probable carcinogen back in 2015.

The District is joining the efforts set out by the County and looking for alternatives to our Integrated Pest Management (IPM). We want to bring awareness to resident and help reduce the amount of harmful herbicides, as well as, fertilizer whose byproducts end up directly in our lagoons.
