Montego Park Tennis Court Update

You may have noticed this past month that the tennis courts at Montego Park were removed as they where rendered non-usable for many years now. The recent construction activities are part of a larger improvement project planned at Montego Park that when completed will feature one (1) post-tensioned (strong and long lasting) tennis court with striping for pickleball and basketball, bocce ball courts, sitting areas, drinking fountain and improved grading and drainage. The first phase of the project occurring Fall 2017 / Spring 2018 is for the removal of the old tennis courts and construction of one (1) new multi-purpose court.

All of these planned improvements are part of the approved Parks and Open Spaces Master Plan which utilizes a combination of Marin Co. Measure A tax dollars and BMKCSD operating funds to implement projects brought to the community throughout a lengthy outreach and participation program back in 2015. Updates will be provided in the Neighbor to Neighbor and District website for ongoing improvements which are expected to be implemented in the next 12-24 months as funding is allocated.

<u>Sunset Park All Fitness</u> Equipment Installation

All Ages Fitness has arrived at the Bel Marin Keys. In keeping with the Parks and Open Spaces Master Plan we have installed the first of several planned outdoor fitness stations throughout the Keys at Sunset Park. Here you will find Chair" а "Captains where you can get a good abs workout or use it for dips. A "Sit-up Bench" makes it easy to hold your feet steady while you perform a situp and is large enough to



be a multi-functional workout bench. The third piece of equipment is "Push-up Bars" and with two (2) levels of bars provides for different ability levels to utilize. Bring your neighbors to Sunset Park and have a group workout!

Look for future stations around the Keys as we put



your Measure A tax dollars to use for the parks and open space of our community. Have a piece of equipment in mind that you would like installed next? Just let the District office know at and recommen-

dations will be taken into consideration for the future sites.

Buoy Cleaning

This winter the District will be conducting a comprehensive inspection of all the ski area buoys in both North and South Lagoons. Each ski area will be inspected individually, and buoys will be removed for approximately 5 days. A <u>NO WAKE</u> <u>ZONE</u> will be in effect for the ski area until the buoys are replaced. Once the buoys are inspected and repaired, they will be replaced in the same location and shoreline offset (125'/South Lagoon and 150'/North Lagoon). Inspections are anticipated to begin in January and notification of which ski area to be closed will be on the marquee and website.

<u>Novato Passes Measure D: Ordinance</u> <u>amending the General Plan to continue the</u> <u>Urban Growth Boundary to 2042</u>

Novato voted in <u>favor of</u> continuing the city's expiring Urban Growth Boundary Law—which limits development outside of the established limits—until 2042. BMK resident Sue Lattanzio (long time advocate for the environment and preservation of our open space) alongside the Greenbelt Alliance, Marin Conservation League and Sierra Club worked together closely with the Novato City Council and staff to ensure that the voters would support the renewal of the Urban Growth Boundary.



Culvert Gates

The South Lagoon Culvert Project is continuing. The District undertook efforts this summer to replace the three gate doors which had reached the end of their serviceable life. issues arose with the integrality of the concrete wall and a new plan to attack the project was necessary. The final stages of construction will be occurring after the first of the year.
