STOP THE BLEED

FREE TRAINING JULY 29th AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER

Launched in October of 2015, Stop the Bleed is a national awareness campaign and a call to action. Stop the Bleed is intended to cultivate grassroots efforts that encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.

We have four modules (90 minutes each) starting promptly at 8:30AM, 10:30AM, 1PM AND 3PM.#Please note: All participants should wear appropriate clothing—simulated blood may get on clothing. The course involves a PowerPoint and hands-on training with simulated wounds. A certificate of completion will be provided. A list of recommended supplies and sources for first aid and bleeding control materials will be provided and can also be purchased on site.

<u>Measure A</u>

The next installment of outdoor all ages fitness equipment is underway! The sites selected for installation are the North end of Caribe, Cavalla Cay Park, and Bahama West (just north of the boat ramp). A wide range of equipment is on the way suitable for total body workouts, especially when paired with some running or walking! The aim of this project is to have all sites accessible to different ages and abilities. This new equipment is in addition to the existing all ages fitness site installed at Sunset Park, located on the South side of BMK blvd (just east of Del Oro), consisting of a Sit-Up



Bench, Push-Up Bars, and a Captain's Chair. The District office has received a copious amount of encouragement and praise for the Sunset Park site and will continue with the following equipment selections: the North side of Caribe will receive a Balance Beam, Accessible Hand Cycle and a Balance Board; Bahama West will have a Recumbent Cycle, a Balance Plank Station, and a Sit-up/Back Extension Bench; and at Cavalla Cay Park you will find a Shoulder Rotator, High and Low Chin Up Bars, and a set of three (3) Plyometric Box Stations of differing heights. Instructions for use will be posted at each site.

The funds for this project have been allocated from the Measure A quarter-cent sales tax that supports programs and benefits parks, open space, and agricultural lands across Marin.

Mosquito or Not ?

Did you know that there are over 3,500 species of mosquito, but only a couple hundred feed off human blood? Never fear! Not all creatures that fly and buzz are blood sucking parasites, some can even be beneficial. Please note mosquito abatement is actively monitoring our area and being treated as needed. There are many creatures that resemble mosquitoes, but in fact are not. Included in this list are midges, gnats, and crane flies (basically the daddy long legs of the insect world). <u>Culvert Gate Installation</u>

The three 7'x7' cast iron gates located at the entry to BMK were replaced recently with three stainless steel slide gates mounted to a precast concrete panel weighing 30,000 lbs. The concrete panel with the stainless steel slide gates were fabricated in Redding, CA and delivered to BMK in mid-March. Two cranes worked in concert to lift the panel off a tractor trailer to a ver-



tical position and then lowered the 15 ton panel underwater in front of the existing concrete headwall. Global Diving and Salvage from Mare Island was the contractor selected for the project. This project is a vital component of infrastructure for the District as one of its water exchanges for its South Lagoon and flood control structure. The project was funded entirely by the District.



Damaged Docks

In efforts to keep our waterways clean we will continue to survey the condition of floats and docks in Novato Creek, North and South Lagoon. Some of these dock and floats have been identified as being in a rather poor state of disrepair and may be contributing to increase debris and can become a navigational hazard. In the past, pieces of float material were lodged into a precarious position in the lock door which resulted in rather costly repairs to the hydraulic systems associated with the operation of the locks. The District Office regularly receives calls from debris washing ashore to neighbor's shorelines, as well as, accumulated debris along the levee. We ask that residents please take a moment and assess docks and floats to ensure they are in good working order.

<u>Fishing</u>

Reminder: Everyone <u>16 or older</u> needs a valid sport fishing license in their possession when they are fishing. Please be considerate to our aquatic friends when you are fishing and practice safe catch and release protocols. Please remember that there is no fishing off any District owned property (i.e. parks, locks, ramps)

Novato Creek Navigation Seminars

Since 2015, BMKCSD has offered a navigation seminar of Novato Creek free of charge for residents. At certain times, Novato Creek can be tricky to navigate especially out past the mouth of the creek until you reach the San Pablo Bay channel. Foth-CLE Engineering Inc., was contracted to conduct a survey of Novato Creek from Highway 37 out to the channel markers in San Pablo Bay last November. The high resolution survey is a critical tool for understanding the depths of the creek and how to navigate your vessel. This year we have added a couple of useful tools in addition to reviewing the survey results; 1) Aerial drone footage was taken at a low tide in March to help mariners understand where the shoals and mud flats are that you don't see at high tide 2) Cross sections taken at each piling/channel marker assist with understanding how far away the channel lies from each numbered piling. The first seminar was held May 16th with a large turnout of 25 residents! Currently another seminar will be held on Wednesday, June 13th at 7:30 pm at the Community Center. We plan to hold a weekend seminar in mid to late June as well. If you are interested in attending please contact the District at (415) 883-4222 or email admin@bmkcsd.us for more information. Water Safety in Our Lagoons


Summer is approaching and we want to remind residents to follow the Waterways Regulations set forth by Chapter 11.36, Marin County Code Harbors and Waterways. We would like to remind residents to the following code sections:

Section 11.36.06-Water Skiing: "all water skiing shall follow a counter clockwise pattern, and shall be limited to the designated ski areas; as shown on the Water Safety Map

Section 11.36.065-Wake Surfing Prohibited: "no vessel operator shall intentionally engage in any water sport in which the sport participant is propelled entirely or substantially by the force of the vessels wake alone"

We would also like to remind residents that you are responsible for your boats wake and must abide by the "**No Wake**" zone areas as outline in the Waterways Map (see page 3). If you have guests please ensure that they understand the Waterway Regulations we can ensure a safe waterway for all to enjoy. Let's keep our lagoons safe!

She was preceded in death by her husband, Robert.
