Flooding in and around our District

Over the past few weeks we have received an enormous amount of rain. In and around our District we have experienced levee breaches, one near the CA 37 Bridge and two at Pacheco Pond. As a District we have been in communication with the State Coastal Conservancy and the County of Marin regarding impacts these breaches have caused to the Bel Main Keys Community Services District. For the Pacheco Pond levee breaches the State Coastal Conservancy has been responsive about emergency repairs. All of these issues we are experiencing highlights the need for various agencies and stakeholders to work more closely to manage and maintain a very fragile flood control infrastructure. Over the coming months the District will be meeting with the County, State Coastal Conservancy and City of Novato to bring that to light and seek actions on measures that should take place to insure the safety of our community as a whole.



Montego Park

As many residents are aware Montego Park is undergoing renovations with the new tennis/mulit-purpose court. We will be continuing work on the next phase this summer and fall with the installation of new bocce ball courts. In our phased approach at the park, and as we have budget available, we will eventually be addressing the flooding of the park during the rainy season which has been quite challenging this year. The overall original design of the park had water from adjacent parcels flow into the park acting more as a detention pond with some drains that are no longer operational. The District is for now moving rain water with pumps and will continue to do so until a long term fix is constructed likely in fiscal year 2020/21.

Parking and Intersections Safety

The District met with the County of Marin public works group, at the direction of the BMKCSD Board of Directors, to discuss the proper marking of curbs and no parking zones to better enhance visibility and safety at the intersections and boat ramps through out the community. At this point, we have made our recommendations and received feedback from the County on items that can be done via work order, and items that will need to go to the Board of Supervisors for approval. Most areas are enhancements to existing signage. We also ask for resident who live on a corner street to be mindful of vegetation and trim back as some are areas are becoming a line of sight issue for cars pulling out of the intersection. We are also continually addressing the speeding issue and looking to install a speed radar sign on the boulevard which will be reviewed by the County prior to installation.

Winter Lagoon Levels for Flood Control

Over the past two months, we have experienced significant amounts of rain in a short period. Several factors are weighed in determining how low to take the lagoons down prior to a storm event. Current level of ground saturation, tides during the predicted storm, and constant monitoring of several weather stations are a few of the factors in lowering which can take several days to accomplish. Every inch of measured rainfall equals 2-3" of rise in the lagoons. In some cases when pacific storms stall and slow down once hitting the coast the forecasted rainfall may increase by 1-2" within 12hrs of making landfall. This may present an issue attempting to lower the lagoons once the storm has passed as Novato Creek is well above the predicted tides. To compensate for the unknown is the best tool and lowering a little more than necessary has proven a worthy tactic.

Novato Creek Survey and 2019 Navigation Seminars

The annual survey of Novato Creek is completed and will be on the website by mid-April. Similar to the past few years, BMKCSD will hold Novato creek navigation seminars late spring and summer. The seminars will consist of changes to navigation, review of the survey, aerial video of the creek at a 0.0' mean low low water tide and more. In addition to the 2019 seminars, another improvement to aid boaters is a real time tide gauge located at the mouth of Novato creek. BMK collaborated with the county of Marin on the locations, installation and maintenance of the gauge.
