b. North Lagoon Sluice Gate/Stoplogs

Three quotes for Stoplogs, still researching material, transportation, installation, crane, and overall costs is still pending; and is dependent on the cost of the dredge. Also need a crane price.

Discussion included talk about anticipation of rain and rising lagoon water which brings up the need to lower prior to rain; however, as the rainy season progresses, even with low tide it is challenging to wait for the Creek to be lower than the lagoon due to runoff, and this past season so excessive runoff not seen before.

Ensure that we can add on for climate change and sea level rise.
