# President's Message

Community Updates: Lagoons, Roadway Safety, and Upcoming Town Halls

I want to share a few important updates happening in our community...



### Lagoon Water Quality

Both lagoons continue to experience algae challenges this season. Earlier this summer, water samples were taken by one company, but there have been concerns about the accuracy of those results. For that reason, we've scheduled retesting, with results expected by September 12, 2025. These results are critical to ensure that the right steps are taken to address the issues we're facing.

Preliminary testing has shown elevated levels of phosphorus and other nutrients, which can fuel algae growth. Unfortunately, flushing is not currently an option since the creek water is considered unhealthy. We'll keep you updated as soon as the new test results are in. It's worth noting that we're not alone—this has been a difficult algae year across the Bay Area.

### **Roadway Safety Projects**

We are actively working with the County Department of Public Works (DPW) on roadway safety projects. To give residents the opportunity to learn more and provide input, we are planning a Town Hall meeting with DPW staff in attendance. This Town Hall will be in the fall time frame and plenty of notice will be provided so everyone can participate.

In the meantime, we have arranged extra patrols from the Sheriff's Office and CHP to help reduce speeding and address repeated stop sign violations.

### Measure G Update

We are also planning a Measure G Town Hall in the near future. This will be a chance for residents to learn about progress and next steps. The exact date will be announced soon.

### Water Quality by Brian Clark



Recently, the creek water has become so unhealthy, we have decided to stop flushing until the Department of Public Works is willing to fix the sluice gate in the creek. It is stuck in the open position. The water mixing from Pacheco Pond and further upstream is a health hazard and the CSD will not risk anyone getting sick from enjoying the lagoons. Currently, both lagoons have high Phosphorus and lower dissolved oxygen levels. This is not harmful to humans, but it is creating stress on the fish in the lagoons. We are testing the water on a regular basis and waiting on proposals for harvesting the widgeon grass and treating the algae in the North Lagoon as well as treating the South Lagoon for clarity. More diffusers will be added to the North Lagoon to bring up the dissolved oxygen levels.

Being that we are brackish water, there aren't many products we can use without getting permits and shutting down the lagoons. This is why we are relying on professionals. We want it treated correctly the first time without mistakes. The CSD has a widgeon grass cutter we are willing to loan out to any resident who wishes to maintain the area behind or in front of their docks. Manually raking the algae is currently the best way to remove it. This summer has been a difficult maintenance year all the way around.

Between lagoon issues, vandalism, parking, and illegal dumping, the CSD has been very busy trying to maintain the community as a whole. Your phone calls, emails and inquiries are being addressed. Thank you for your patience and hopefully things will start to turn around soon.






# Where Can You Ride an E-Bike in Marin? E-Bike Policies in Marin County



- Golden Gate National Recreation Area: Allows all electric bikes, as long as the rider uses pedal-assist (use of throttles prohibited), on roads, fire roads, and trails that are open to bikes. Riders must obey the 15 MPH speed limit (5 MPH when passing other trail users and approaching blind curves). Please check the GGNRA compendium for specific rules for trail-specific speed limits and restrictions.
- Pt. Reyes National Seashore: Class 1 e-bikes are allowed wherever bikes are allowed, unless otherwise posted.
- California State Parks: A recently released e-bike-specific policy states that electric bikes are not allowed on park trails and
  fire roads without a Superintendent's Order. At this time, China Camp State Park and Angel Island State Park are the only
  State Parks in Marin to release such an order, allowing Class I as an evaluation pilot program.
- Marin Water District: Starting July 1, 2025, Class 1 e-bikes are allowed wherever conventional bikes are permitted, which
  includes public roads, parking lots, and unpaved roads not signed against such use, for a 2-year pilot program. Read more
  on Marin Water's website.
- Marin County Parks & Open Space Preserves: Class 1 and 2 e-bikes are allowed on paved multi-use pathways, but prohibited on all unpaved fire roads and multi-use trails (subject to change).
- Tamarancho: Electric bikes are allowed.



### Consumer Protection Tip

Marin DA's office offers free mediation services.

The Marin County District Attorney's Office offers a free and confidential mediation program to help Marin residents resolve disputes before they escalate to court. Through its Consumer Protection Unit, the DA's office assists with a wide range of issues, including consumer complaints, landlord-tenant disputes, neighbor conflicts, real property issues and more.

Mediation is a voluntary process where trained staff help the parties communicate and reach a mutually acceptable resolution. The process is informal, efficient and completely free of charge. No attorneys are required, and most cases are resolved quickly - without the time, stress and cost of litigation. A bilingual mediator is available to assist clients directly in Spanish.





Dogs are vulnerable to extreme weather, so it is important to keep them indoors during dangerously hot or cold weather.

In Heat: When walking your dog, protect their paws from the hot pavement. Make sure they have shade and plenty of water. As always, pick up after your pet.

In Cold: Provide a dry, insulated shelter during cold weather for outdoor-dwelling dogs, but indoor housing is always best in extreme weather.

During these weather conditions ensure they have a safe, comfortable environment.



Mahjong's origins can be traced back to China in the mid-1800s, during the declining years of the Qing Dynasty. It is thought to have emerged in the eastern parts of China, possibly evolving from earlier Chinese tile-based games. The name "Mahjong" itself translates to "the game of sparrows," hinting at the game's cultural importance and the traditions connected to it. Over time, Mahjong spread and became popular in different areas during the 20th century. There are many regional versions of the game, such as American Mahjong, which has a yearly rotating set of winning hands. Mahjong requires a blend of skill, strategic thinking, and a bit of luck.

Mahjong is a game typically played by four players and utilizes 114 tiles. The gameplay involves strategic collection and discarding of tiles to form specific winning combinations, much like the card game Rummy. The mahjong tiles consist of three suits (Craks, Bams, and Dots), Wind tiles (East, South, West, North), Dragon tiles (Red Dragon, Green Dragon, White Dragon), Flowers, Seasons, and Jokers.

The goal of Mahjong mirrors that of poker; the objective is to construct matching sets and pairs. A set is defined as either three or four identical tiles or three consecutive tiles, also referred to

as "melds." A pair consists of two tiles of the same value, frequently termed "eyes." To emerge victorious in Mahjong, a player must assemble four sets and one pair.

The core of successful Mahjong play lies in strategic decision-making and adaptability. Skilled players excel at;

**Optimizing Hands:** They meticulously arrange their tiles to create strong, flexible combinations, increasing their winning potential.

Analyzing Opponents: They observe discarded tiles to understand their rivals' strategies, enabling them to anticipate moves and adjust their own tactics.

Strategic Aggression and Defense: Mahjong demands a delicate balance. Players must know when to push for a win and when to prioritize defense to prevent losses.

Mid-Game Adaptability: They can modify their strategies in response to changing tile availability and opponents' actions, ensuring they remain competitive.

Consistent Decision-Making: Over time, skillful play becomes more valuable as players consistently make the right decisions.

This involves understanding how to balance attacking for a win with protecting against your opponents.



\*Tip: If multiple people reach for the tile to win, the player with the next closest turn wins the tile and the hand. To ensure you don't miss the opportunity, you must declare "Suk!" or "Eat!" or simply "Mahjong!".

Mahjong offers numerous benefits. It sharpens memory, improves concentration, and cultivates strategic thinking while also promoting social connections and providing a stimulating mental workout, particularly for seniors. Studies show that increased Mahjong experience correlates with enhanced cognitive, psychological, and functional capabilities. As a therapeutic tool, Mahjong has been shown to improve general cognitive function, short-term memory, and alleviate depressive symptoms.

Mahjong is a game that blends luck and skill. While luck can influence short-term outcomes, skilled players can increase their winning chances through strategic thinking, adaptability, and a thorough understanding of the game. Though there is no universally topranked board game, Mahjong consistently receives high marks for popularity and critical praise.

The label "Harbor" under a control switch refers to the Lagoon gate.


The system will **NOT** allow you to open both gates simultaneously. One gate MUST BE CLOSED before the other gate is open.


